- 3. Any number of entries may be made in all classes.
- 4. Please bring your exhibits to Whalton Village Hall between 5.00 p.m. and 7.00 p.m. on Friday, 15th September or between 9.00 a.m. and 12 noon on the morning of the Show to enter them for judging.
- Judges decisions to be final. Judges may make classes void at their discretion.
- 6. All flowers and vegetables must be grown by the exhibitor.
- 7. No commercial mixes allowed in the cookery classes
- Any competitor found not complying with these rules will forfeit any prize and their exhibit removed from public display.
- Whalton Village Hall accepts no responsibility for exhibits and competitors property.
- 10. Any person objecting to any exhibit as not conforming to the rules must lodge their objection in writing to the Secretary before 3pm on the day of the show. The Committee's decision is final.
- 11. No exhibits to be removed before 3.15pm.
- 12. All prize money will be awarded after 3.30pm on the day of the show, on production of prize ticket to Treasurer.
- 13. Exhibits left after 3.30pm will be classed as donations and will be auctioned off and funds raised will be included in the show proceeds.
- 14. Prize monies will be available for 7 days after the show.
